COVID-19 RESPONSE: UPDATE #8

LNG Canada and JGC Fluor (JFJV) continue to implement important measures to help reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus. As outlined in our previous [COVID-19 Response updates](#), we're taking firm and prudent actions to promote the safety and well-being of our project's workforce and the communities in which we live and operate.

UPDATED COVID-19 MEASURES TAKEN

- Effective April 20, all LNG Canada Project personnel travelling by air are required to wear a non-medical mask or face covering at airport screening checkpoints or whenever maintaining physical distancing from others is not possible.
 - This applies to both commercial and charter flights and is aligned with direction given by the federal government in [New Measures introduced for non-medical masks or face coverings in the Canadian transportation system](#).
 - For workers that are currently onsite and scheduled to depart Kitimat by flight at the end of their rotation, LNG Canada and JFJV will provide a face mask for their flight home.
 - Project personnel to follow the current [Public Health Agency of Canada's guidance](#) on face coverings.
- On April 23, B.C.'s Provincial Health Officer issued an [Order](#) to a number of industries that have worksites and workforce accommodations. The Order contains several additional COVID-19 mitigation measures and guidelines to further combat the transmission of the virus. We are committed to complying with this Order and all relevant requirements and guidelines, and will continue to work closely with accommodation providers, the Northern Health authority and the provincial government on any new steps to protect our people and the communities in which we live and work.

Looking Ahead

It is expected that some form of restrictions will remain in place in British Columbia for the foreseeable future. As always, we are monitoring the COVID-19 situation closely and are following advice from public health authorities to ensure the well-being of people and communities. As we move forward adjustments to our essential works activities will need to be made and we will do this with primary consideration to the safety aspects of doing so.

This is a complex and evolving situation, which will require us to consider many factors, including:

- Direction from public health authorities
- Safety protocols for the workplace, such as physical distancing, hygiene, screening measures, schedule rotations, etc
- Flexibility where possible for a blend of work from home and office for non-business critical staff

Our approach remains aligned with direction from the Government of Canada and Government of British Columbia. We continue to monitor the situation and adjust our plans and actions as required.
