Two alcohol and drug (A&D) tests will be required – one A&D test before the program starts and one before the successful applicants begins work on the LNG Canada site.

The LNG Canada Project has a mandatory vaccination program in place. This means anyone entering the project site must be fully vaccinated.

To qualify as "fully vaccinated", a person must have received a full series of a Health Canada-approved COVID-19 vaccine (combinations of approved vaccines are also acceptable) with the last dose having been administered at least fourteen days prior to the day of arrival at site.
